Elder Board Insights/Pastoral Search Update Clint Jones, March 2024

When Jesus knew his time was short, his "upper room discourse" around dinner with his disciples (recorded in John 14) provides incredibly concise insight into the dawn of the Church Age (you know, that we all find ourselves in now!).

"If you love me, you will obey what I command. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever – The Spirit of Truth" (v15-17). Jesus states further that, with the Holy Spirit, we will accomplish greater ministry than he would!

Jesus incarnate was only one place at a time, now with the Spirit we are everywhere. We take God with us where we do ministry. Together WE do ministry here at Edgewood. In the power of the Holy Spirit.

March 24, Palm Sunday this year, will be our next Annual Meeting. We will vote on budget, new positions, and a change to the constitution for terms. While this seems routine, in reality our church enters Year Two without a lead pastor in what increasingly appears to be a non-routine ministry landscape. And although it also took this long with pastor Kevin 10 years ago, there are some key differences that I see as Elder Board and Search Team Chair. The pool of available pastoral candidates is shrinking; more churches are closing (and pastors leaving ministry) than are being planted in the U.S. every year now. Fewer young people are being trained and going into full-time ministry. This leads me to believe that Edgewood needs to do 3 things: (1) be patient in God's timing for us - a body of believers whom I am confident HE LOVES! (2) pray for God's guidance to Edgewood leadership, and (3) in this era of difficult hiring, be open to other arrangements where ministry at Edgewood might successfully reach greater numbers.

Our sanctuary can hold 500 people for a service. Our morning and afternoon services currently run under 100 each. The building is paid for, and we are trying to keep it in good condition, as good stewards. For sure we would like to minister to greater numbers, and also to be good stewards of the space God has given us (and to fulfill the Great Commission).

Over the next 9 months, beginning after Easter, we have contracted Stan Markowski to be part-time Interim Pastor (shared with Northshore and his current duties, scaled back). He will provide more continuity week to week in our sermons. I am going to ask him to preach through a book of scripture (which would have been difficult with this past year's arrangement). So, for sure you will hear him more on Sundays from the pulpit (expect about 2/3 of the time). More importantly though, we will ask Stan as interim to work with elders and staff to review any/all functions at Edgewood in preparation for who (what?) comes next. We will have the expertise of the Northshore Community Church to help us, as well, to review how we do ministry/ worship/ communication/ business.



At the same time, the Search Team will review candidates who respond to our job openings at key seminaries, or direct requests to folks that we may reach out to.

Finally, a subcommittee of elders will meet regularly with Northshore elders and pastors, while Stan is in "residency", to learn from them and strategize where or how we might come together with efficiencies in our ministries. We are essentially "sister" churches, both started in the '60s, and both members of Converge NW (Baptist Conference). I am confident that these actions with Stan and Northshore leadership, no matter what the 9-month "end product" is, will be a benefit toward guiding Edgewood's future.

arrived at my first ministry assignment with CRU in Pasadena, CA, I found out that the person I was supposed to room with was not due to report for a month and a half. That meant I needed to find temporary housing for about six weeks, until the Music Training Center started. After talking with my director, I decided to stay in one of the dorms at the US Center for World Missions.

I noticed that there were several Japanese students staying on campus, and found out that they were there in a secular exchange program to learn English. The next several weeks, I got to know the students and volunteered to speak English with them in the evenings. One student in particular seemed very interested in why I was there and kept asking me questions about God. I finally asked a staff member why he was so interested in Christianity and he said he had received Christ the week before I arrived.

Shinya Iwasaki and I built a friendship in the days that followed, although the language barrier would sometimes present a problem. After I moved out of the dorm, we would still occasionally go to lunch together. He eventually returned to Japan, which made it more difficult to keep in touch. I unfortunately lost track of him after he moved out of his parents' house in Yokohama.

Several years later, I traveled to Tokyo to do a series of concerts. I felt impressed to find my old friend, and was able to contact him with the assistance of a Japanese staff member. As a result, we were able to hang out for an entire afternoon. Though his English was in decline, we had a good time and communicated the best we could. Before he took me back to the train station, he said his mother wanted to talk to me on the phone. I really didn't know why because she didn't speak a word of English. But I agreed, and he dialed her number and handed me the phone.

She began speaking to me with great

emotion in her voice. Although I couldn't recognize any of the words, I somehow began to understand what she was saying. When we hung up, I asked Shinya what she had said. He paused for a while, and then said in broken English, "Thank you for helping my son." I knew then why God had me stay at the US Center for World Missions. What originally had been a great inconvenience for me, ended up becoming a tremendous blessing. For on that day I clearly witnessed that there are absolutely no language barriers when it comes to hearing the spoken words of a mother's heart.

Easter Guest Speaker


